

L/ST404 Course Description: This course is designed to produce a deeper awareness of concepts and practices that are basic to the arts, their forms, and their relationships to societies and issues. We will explore the effects of religion, Enlightenment philosophy, Modernism, & multiculturalism on the arts. Methodology in arts education will be developed through a variety of teaching strategies that may be applied at all levels of education. (3 units)



L/ST 211 Theatre, Dance & Movement for the Inclusive Elementary Classroom **Study Abroad:**



This study Abroad is available to students wishing to take **Either or both** L/ST 211 and L/ST 404.

L/ST211 Course Description: Use of theatre and dance/movement in the elementary classroom. Application of theatre and dance/ movement elements to teaching methods and public speaking. Emphasis on understanding how prejudice, values and stereotyping influence choices and judgments about performance arts. (3 units)

Chiang Mai museums offer arts and culture of the Kingdom of Lan Na, as well as local hill tribes. There are universities and teacher training colleges in Chiang Mai, giving CSULB students an opportunity for cultural exchange with peers. Traditional puppetry and classical Lanna dance are actively practiced and we will experience both during the class.
