#### **INSURANCE**

Foreign students **must** have a health and accident insurance coverage that complies with Swiss regulations. If a foreign health and accident insurance does not offer the minimum coverage required by Swiss law, the exchange student will have to contract a Swiss health and accident insurance. #### **VISA PROCEDURE**

Students should apply to the Swiss diplomatic representation in their own country in order to complete the necessary administrative procedure. It is very important that these formalities are started within the time limits set, i.e. 2 to 3 months before their arrival in Switzerland. #### **RESIDENCE IN SWITZERLAND**

#### Permission to reside

Upon arrival in Switzerland, the student must go personally to the Foreign Registration Office (*Bureau des étrangers*) of his/her town of residence. Cost of Residence Permit:

- Student coming from a country within the EU: between CHF 65 and CHF 120, depending on the municipality of residence.
- Student coming from a country outside the EU: between CHF 150 and CHF 280, depending on the municipality of residence.
